He worked with Brian and Jeff up to the end to keep the office of secretary functioning until we were able to elect a replacement.

Brother Tuma has also had some success in his appointment as Chairman of the Communications Committee. We have long struggled with how to get updates out to brethren who, for one reason or another, have not embraced the more modern methods of communication. The committee came up with an online dialing system that allows us to send out timely messages to brothers who have not yet registered an email address with the lodge. We have employed it twice already in the first two weeks of operation.

The Communications Committee needs volunteers who are willing to scan in documents. We, as a lodge, spent about nine hundred dollars through our Webmaster Chris Sullivan to build an online secure storage system to store and preserve our records. It is now up and working and waiting for the first documents to be uploaded to it. We need brothers to come in assist with the archiving process. Please contact Dan Tuma if you are available to assist.

The Brian Galusha Memorial Blood Drive was not well attended. Only two brothers from our lodge donated blood. Our brother deserved more than that. Please look at your calendar today and block July 11th at Kena Shrine for the next blood drive. Block your calendar and Pre-Register by emailing or calling our blood coordinator. Brian Galusha Final Message Apr-2009

Worshipful Brian Wells Galusha, our lodge Secretary, laid down his working tools on April 16^{th,} 2009 following a fourteen-month battle with pancreatic cancer. With his family by his side, he passed into the lodge not made with hands eternal in the heavens.

Our Worshipful Brother will indeed be missed. But we can easily see the effect of his good works in the strength and success of our lodge. Let us not forget the faithful service of our departed brother and friend, may his memory remain close to our hearts and his example be an inspiration to us all.

Bro. Brian was born in the small town of Granville, NY on October 13th, 1943. He was the youngest son of Howard Galusha and Edna Forman. Much of his childhood was spent enjoying the bounty and beauty of nature in the endless woods, mountains and streams that surrounded his home. He hunted and trapped, then sold his daily catch to markets and furriers to earn spending money. As a teenager, Bro. Brian stocked shelves at the town grocery store and worked during the summer at Lake George, NY as a short-order cook.

Bro. Brian excelled at his studies at Granville High School and earned a scholarship to attend Syracuse University. While at Syracuse, he participated in ROTC, thus beginning his 20-year career of military service. It was also at Syracuse where he met Carol Elizabeth Cooke of Auburn, NY, his future wife and devoted partner of 42 years.

Bro. Brian graduated in 1965 with a Bachelors of Science Degree in Chemistry and was commissioned a 2nd Lieutenant in the United States Air Force. Bro. Brian's military career lead him across the country and across the globe, from his first assignment as a Missile Launch Officer in a Titan II missile silo in California, to a year away from his loved ones as a Tropical Meteorologist in Southeast Asia, to the distinction of being the Chief Climatologist for the Department of Defense at the Pentagon.

During this time of service to his country, Worshipful Brother Brian continued to pursue knowledge and better himself by earning an additional Bachelors of Science Degree in Meteorology from Penn State in 1972, a Masters Degree in Business Administration from Central Michigan State in 1976 and a Masters Degree in Meteorology from North Carolina State in 1978.

Brian and Carol were blessed with a baby girl, Heather Lynn, in 1970 while stationed at Vandenberg AFB in California. They were again blessed with a son, Jeffrey Brian, in 1975 while stationed at Fort Belvoir in Virginia.

Major Brian Wells Galusha retired from the Air Force in 1985 and began his second career as a Computer Systems Analyst. While working as a contractor with the Federal Aviation Administration in Washington DC, Bro. Brian assisted in the development, testing and fielding of automated weather, maintenance, and air traffic control systems. His leadership and expertise in these projects helped to modernize air travel, and ensure the safe and efficient transportation that millions of people rely on every day. He retired in 2005 after two decades of work in the service of others.

Family and the Galusha name were important to Brian. He and Carol became grandparents in 1992 when Brian Phillips, his namesake, was born to their daughter Heather. He was an active genealogist and spent many hours researching the ancestry of his extended family. Brother Brian was able to trace his roots to New England in the 1640's and his wife Carol's family back to the Revolutionary War. He was always happy to share his knowledge and did not hesitate to answer the queries of stranger and friend alike.

It was in his labor as a Freemason where Worshipful Brian Wells Galusha found the most enjoyment and satisfaction. He was inspired to seek light by his Brother, Wayne Galusha, a member of Granville Lodge No. 55 in Granville, NY. He was honored to follow in the footsteps of his Grandfather, William Forman, a member of Morning Flower Lodge No. 71 in Pawlet, VT and his Great Grandfather, John Forman, a member of Cohoes Lodge #116 in Cohoes, NY. It gave Bro. Brian great joy to raise his son Jeffrey as a Master Mason of ACGL, thus ensuring that his family's Masonic tradition will continue.

Brian was raised a Master Mason at Arlington Centennial – Glebe Lodge No. 81 on November 16th, 1998. He was a Life Member in Perpetuity of his mother lodge as well as Sharon Lodge No. 327. He served as Worshipful Master of ACGL in 2003, and then as lodge secretary from 2004. Brian joined Kena Shrine in 2003 and served on the Director's Staff. He proudly marched with the Legion of Honor and served as their commander in 2008. Bro. Brian became a Master of the Royal Secret in the Valley of Alexandria, Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite in 2003 and served as Almoner since June of 2007. Bro. Brian also served as the 54th Masonic District's Blood Donor Coordinator for five years and helped to save hundreds of lives through the donation of his own blood and blood platelets. His cable-tow knew no limit, and he was active in the service of his lodge and brethren until the day the Great Architect of the Universe called him to receive his wages.

Many words can be used to describe Worshipful Brian Wells Galusha; Service, Selfless, Friend, Brother, Mentor, Husband, Father and Grandfather. Above all, our friend and brother was the embodiment of these two words, "Master Mason".
