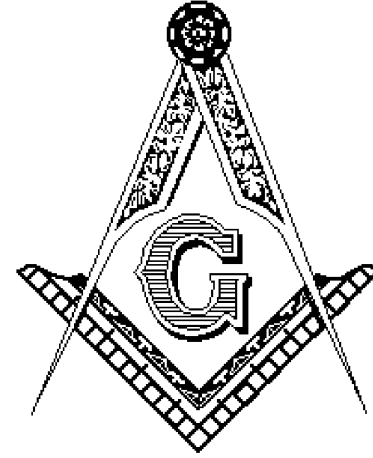

## From the East

Brethren:

July is upon us. As we remember the Independence Day holiday I hope that we would also remember that there were worthy brethren from lodges like our own who played a major part in securing it. The most famous and the ones everyone typically knows are of course, George Washington, Benjamin Franklin, Paul Revere, John Paul Jones, The Marquis de Lafayette, Henry Knox, Joseph Warren, Barron Von Steuben, and Richard Montgomery. These brothers contributed in ways that became their legacy. As in any war that our country has been in these famous brethren make up just a small portion of the membership of our lodges that were affected. There were many others from all walks of life who fought and died for the freedoms that our institution holds dear. It is not just to the occupations of politicians, architects and generals that masons aspired. It was the farmers, blacksmiths, and all other trades that made up everyday life in colonial America. Not all masons were died in the wool revolutionaries either. Imagine the debate that must have gone on when men who were both loyalists and revolutionaries met under the roof of a lodge in such an unsure time as that. So let us keep in our remembrances during this time the sacrifices of all of our Masonic fellows.

Masons have been involved in every struggle that our country has been through. The qualities that make a good man right for masonry also tend to get him involved when his country is in need. These qualities make it very hard to sit by while others defend those values. Needless to say we have had many Masonic veterans. We saw this in our own lodge in may on memorial day when half the lodge stood when I asked those who had served their country in the military to stand and introduce themselves.

The Grand Master this year is dedicating a memorial to the memory of the brothers who fought and died in World War II at the D-Day Invasion. On October 10<sup>th</sup> 2009, as a part of the Masonic Family Day celebration, a memorial will be placed in a predominant spot near the services memorial on the grounds of the Grand Lodge and Masonic Home in Richmond. As a part of this event, and to help in paying for the memorial, the Grand Lodge is placing Masonic pavers with a two line message for donations of 300 dollars or more. I am proposing that the lodge make a donation and purchase a paver on behalf of our Masonic Veterans. We will vote on this proposal at this month's stated meeting and if approved I will appoint a committee to come up with our pavers message. If you would like to purchase a personal paver, or one for a veteran family member, please contact our Secretary for the application form.

Again, as we are in the warmest part of the year casual wear is still appropriate for the next few stated meetings. No Jeans and T-Shirts please, but coat and tie will not be required. Officers, we are still in formal wear for degrees. And I again stress the importance of the LMIP program. Please contact the Lodge Secretary or visit the Grand Lodge website for more information on this important program. I would like to see a large percentage of our membership participating in this program. Not only does it ensure that your dues will be paid to the lodge now and in memoriam, it simplifies the paperwork and reduces the mailings that the lodge has to do every year. Think about it.

Many of you have asked for more information about the Life Member in Perpetuity (LMIP) program. I have put together a packet that discusses the specifics this program and includes answers to questions frequently asked by interested brethren. The cost of a LMIP is the current lodge dues (\$55.00) multiplied by 16 years, for a total of \$880.00. 2009 dues are not included in this figure. Your 2009 dues card must be paid before your application can be processed by the Grand Lodge of Virginia.

If you decide to become a LMIP, you would never again be asked to mail a dues check to your blue lodge, even if dues increase in the future. In addition and more importantly, after you have passed into the house not made with hands eternal in the heavens, the Grand Lodge of Virginia will continue to pay your dues to Arlington Centennial - Glebe Lodge in perpetuity. I myself am a LMIP. I enjoy not only the peace of mind of never having to worry about paying ever-increasing dues each year, but I also enjoy knowing that I will continue to support my mother lodge long after the Grand Architect of the Universe has called me to receive my wages.
